1 Generating examples

Give an English sentence illustrating each of the following. It is not necessary that we have figured out a way to draw the structures exactly, this is about coming up with examples that show certain configurations. That is: you are not trying to draw trees for these, just provide example sentences.

- 1. An embedded finite declarative.
- 2. An embedded yes-no question.
- 3. An embedded *wh*-question.
- 4. A declarative sentence, in the past tense, with a modal and a progressive verb.
- 5. A declarative sentence, in nonpast tense, with a modal and a perfective verb.
- 6. An embedded infinitive with PRO.
- 7. An embedded infinitive with no PRO.

2 Simple trees

Your task: Draw trees for each of the following sentences. You do not need to draw any features. *Don't forget*, modals are no longer instances to T—T is generally silent and contains only a tense feature. Modals are a form of V now. Also: This has been assigned before we hypothesized any movement, so no movement needs to be shown. (That is for future homework assignments.)

- (1) We bought them.
- (2) We should buy them.
- (3) My brother will have been buying them.
- (4) They have asked us to be monitoring attendance.
- (5) They might want us to have bought the textbook.
- (6) We want them to promise to leave.
