A few trees. Draw the structures for the following sentences in (1), (2), (3) and (4). Follow the examples from the handouts. In this homework, we're interested mostly in the case and agreement features, but write all uninterpretable features under the head they belong to, as in previous homeworks. Cross out the features as they are checked. If you move a head, draw the complex head (Adjunction). If you move anything, draw < > around the trace. We just learned about the DP, so you should be using DPs now. However, before this is due you will likely hear a little bit about *n*P as well, but I do not expect *n*P to be included in these trees. Follow handout 13 and the example below. You should draw the final (complete) tree, rather than steps—and if something moves, draw it in its moved (final) position.

- (1) An unhappy landlord shoveled the wet snow.
- (2) Snowballs have been thrown.
- (3) A giant puddle formed at the corner.
- (4) The snowman was not built by me.

Example: Pat was slapped.
